ernatives. Growing experimentation with the latest formats for products and services, led by adoption of technology, is expected to see a surge. What we're seeing is an en masse re-prioritisation in terms of how the consumer spends time, effort and money. Other brands are already prepping up by keeping tent at the forefront. **Gurgaon:** Based on an RTI activist's complaint, and a subsequent investigation by Police, an FIR has been registered in an alleged case of land-grabbing that involves 2.5 acres of government land near Medanta hospital worth nearly Rs 100 crore, a portion of which has also been purportedly sold to a third party.

The applicant, SK Sharma, had filed an RTI query last year. According to the response he received at the beginning of this year, the land was acquired by HSVP in 1993 and the family of the landowner, Mauji Lal — a resident of Ishlampur village — received a compensation of Rs 24 lakh for it.

However, the mutation of the land was not changed, and in the revenue records, the land continued to be in the name of Mauji Lal, according to the RTI response Sharma received. In 1998, Mauji Lal passed away. His wife Pasto Devi and three daughters — Murthy, Bala and Laxmi — received three remaining instalments of compensation.

The land that was acqui-

red by HSVP with the intention to build residential, commercial and institutional real estate, remains undeveloped till date. Murty Devi claims it was illegally transferred to another resident of Ishlampur village, Ajay Chaudhary through forged release deeds dated June 2014. She claimed Ajay posed as Mauji's grandson to acquire it in his name. Mauji doesn't have a grandson.

The deed bears the name of Mauji's daughter Laxmi as executor. "None of us has signed any release deed in favour of anyone. We came to know that Ajay had transferred the land in his name. The signature and photograph on the registry are not mine, they are fake," said Murty Devi. Sharma, who informed Murty Devi about these irregularities, had filed a police complaint last month. The police reached out to Murty and on the basis of her complaint, a case has been registered at Sadar police station under sections 420 (cheating), 419, 467, 468, 471, 120B of IPC. "We have registered the case and investigation is in progress," said ASI of Sadar police station Kuldeep Kumar.
