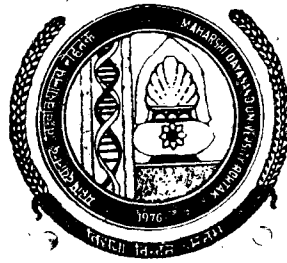

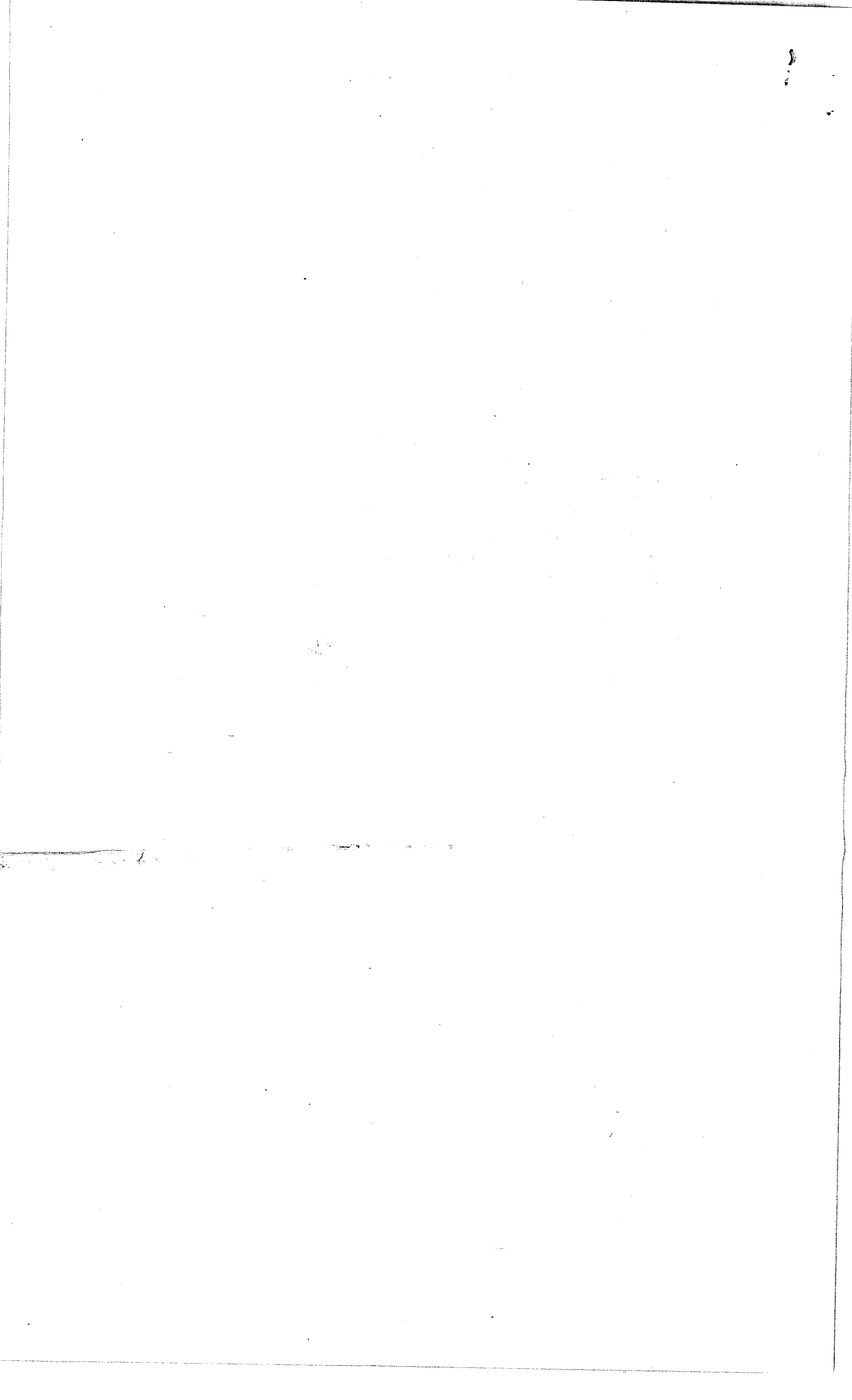

Note : Two general questions with internal choice requiring a first hand knowledge of the book carrying 10 marks each. No critical question will be asked.

Unit-II Jawahar Lal Nehru : "Discovery of India" (only Chapters 5, 7, 8 & 9) are prescribed.

Note : Two general questions with internal choice will be asked from the four prescribed chapters carrying 10 marks each.
