On 29th July 2022, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi announced the introduction of Indian Sigh Language (ISL) as a language subject, which has also given an additional boost to the careers in sign languages in India. These professional courses have extremely good career opportunities in both govt. as well as private sectors such as schools, colleges, institutions and even as freelancers. As per provisions of RPWD act, NEP 2020 and Prime Minister's Emphasis on ISL as a language subject, there will be demand for both ISL teachers and interpreters for providing accessibility. Sign language interpreters are required in numerous settings such as academic, legal, medical etc. it is a challenging yet exciting field.
